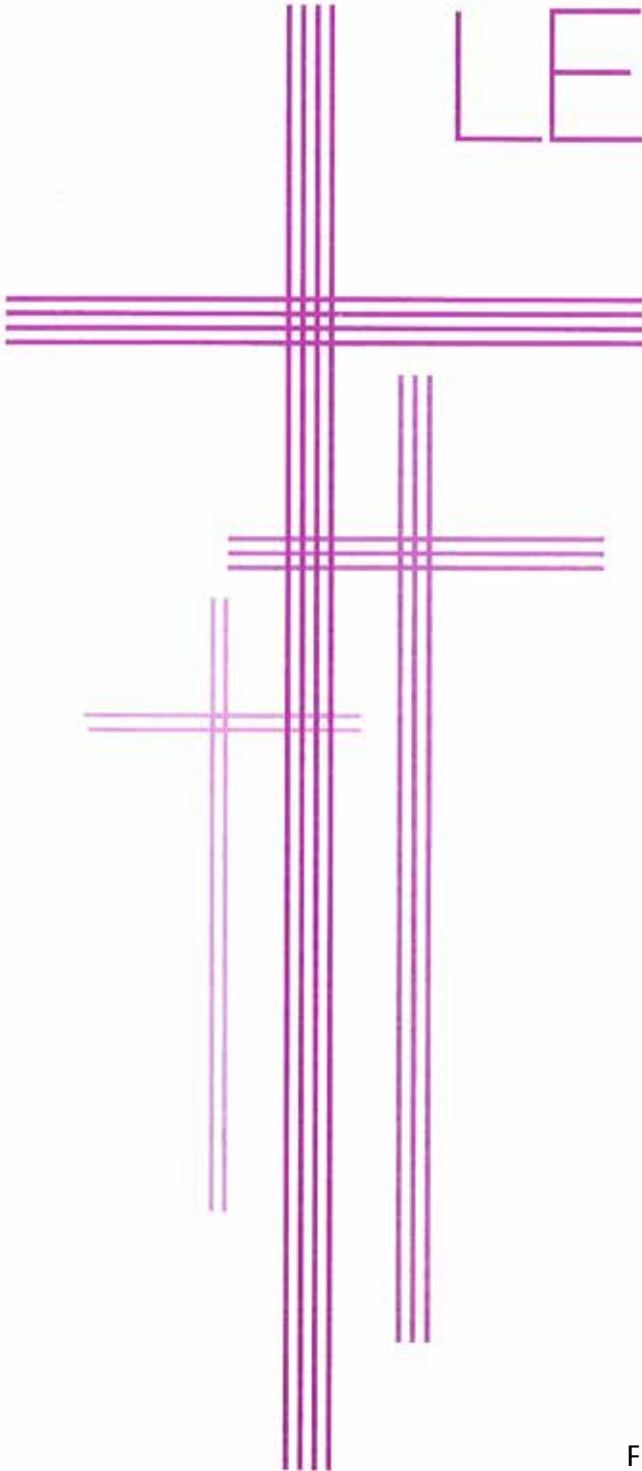

PSALM 31 (NRSV)

<sup>1</sup>O Lord, God of my salvation, when, at night, I cry out in your presence, <sup>2</sup>let my prayer come before you; incline your ear to my cry. <sup>3</sup>For my soul is full of troubles, and my life draws near to Sheol. <sup>4</sup>I am counted among those who go down to the Pit; I am like those who have no help, <sup>5</sup>like those forsaken among the dead, like the slain that lie in the grave, like those whom you remember no more, for they are cut off from your hand. <sup>6</sup>You have put me in the depths of the Pit, in the regions dark and deep. <sup>7</sup>Your wrath lies heavy upon me, and you overwhelm me with all your waves. <sup>8</sup>You have caused my companions to shun me; you have made me a thing of horror to them.
